VI. New Business:

a. New York Networking – 7/20 (J. Rifkin)

- We have the first event of the year this coming Wednesday
- Inviting grads from the past 15 years
- Heather and Craig are co-chairs
- Hope to use this event to spawn others
- The event is unstructured, but we're trying to shift to more structured programs, based on feedback from attendees
- Sevile: if anyone knows alumni living in the NYC area
- Jason and Gabrielle: might be possible to get surrounding areas, not just boroughs
- Rosette: would be worthwhile to get surrounding areas of NYC because older alumni have moved out of the city
- Venue is a double-decker bar; free for the bar area; room for >100 people
- Matt: want to make sure that too many people don't show up
- Not looking for people to RSVP because of "fluid" schedules of recent alumni
- Had about 60-70 in the past



• Bob: anyone from Long Island? There are lots of people out there. (Jason: people who live there weren't invited yet)

b. Graduate Student BBQ (H. Guckes)

- Puzzled because he didn't come up with the new dates
- New date is 9/6, in the Singh Center; get the entire building, inside and outside?
- Emails to grad students will continue, but how many PhDs do we get from each year? Ratio of PhDs to all grad students?
- Will get better attendance because of new arrangement
- Not 9/8, as calendar draft previously indicated
- How to get more grad students to attend?
- Thanks to Gabrielle for helping rearrange
- Gabrielle: changed dates due to renovations, but also to ensure that Masters students are around for the event
- Farnia: when does academic year actually begin for undergrads? (Aug. 30)
- Gabrielle: Should probably be okay because of location (and volunteers) for preventing undergrads to access
- Rosette: I'm happy to advertise to the Masters listserv shortly before the event.
- New setting should be helpful for excluding non-Penn people
- Rosette: We have about 1000 Masters students, so we might have a lot (or too many) students
- Russ: Do we want to still keep the "BBQ" name? Gabrielle: Food is the same, so we'll keep the name.
- Russ: Still going to do September in the future? Answer: We'll see how it goes this year and evaluate going forward.
- Russ: Are we bringing beer back? Gabrielle: Still not allowed.
- Gabrielle: We'll be taking RSVPs to get a sense of how many attendees we'll have and how much food to order.
- Sevile: Send out an email in August to request volunteers, especially since we don't have a meeting before then.
- Bob: We should have a map/plan view to know where everything will be located.

c. Review Proposed New Activities (S. Mannickarottu)

- Reminder: directors are obliged to attend 6 meetings and participate in at least one committee
- Sevile: Recent alumni engagement with the board
 - Try to get more recent alumni involved with the board
 - Want to form committee to explore ideas
- Matt: Welcome to the freshman class
 - Staff a table during NSO to start making new students aware of our brand
 - Want to solve the problem that students don't really know that we're behind events, and then aren't aware of us when they graduate.
 - Set expectation for new students that they'll be part of alumni society
 - Already have contact information from Alumni office
 - Russ: Because NSO is for the whole school, how do we differentiate between SEAS and other students? Matt: We'll be able to advertise. Eric: The school might have events we could participate in too.
 - A chance for us to get started early.
 - Parth: Make sure to differentiate alumni society from Penn Engineering as a whole? Give items that remind them of conversation and information shared.
- Sevile: Networking workshop panel
 - For Masters students, teach how to network
 - Rosette: We have these both for international students and in general for everyone
 - o George: Lots of international students ask about this
 - Matt: Lots of students don't seem to know about Career Services
 - Rosette: Incoming Masters students are required to participate in workshops to participate in OCR. Very high participation rate
 - George: I hear from people "I want to get a job, but I'm not used to introducing myself to people"
 - Rosette: People want a job, not just to talk. We bring in employers, alumni to talk about how to network.
 - For freshmen, we're now talking about Generation Z
 - Matt: It'd be good to know when these events are happening in order to better refer people to Career Services.
 - Sevile: Let's nix this one.
 - Heather: It'd be helpful to have a roleplay-type session. Rosette: We do that too.
- Tim: Safety and Engineering Panel
 - Similar to PE and IP presentations, to augment regular coursework with industry knowledge.
 - A lot of safety can be brought to the table during design, rather than on the tail end of projects.
 - Safety isn't generally covered within engineering education, but it's really important in industry.
 - Want to add a "Safety Through Design" panel presentation/discussion to



begin integrating safety into curriculum.

- Bob: Lots of companies have safety professionals, so the issue is awareness of the students, and we have to start early and in school.
- Parth: For different engineering disciplines, the safety standards are different. Can this event be successful without going into discipline-specific details? Tim: Thanks for the feedback—I'd envision this presentation having a lot of different examples and case-studies to have real-life discussions about what went wrong.
- Hank: This would definitely be worthwhile to try. (Lots of agreement on this.)
- Bob: Make sure people know to take standards into account early on in the design process.
- Sevile: Sounds like we're all for this, so we can form a committee.

Goal: Strengthen ties with the Philadelphia SWE chapter Responsibilities: Previously, invited Philly SWE chapter to the "Back to Penn Engineering" event to tour the Pennovation Center.

2. Engaging the Board

a. Back to Penn Engineering

Goal: Arrange tours and class visits for Board members. Previous events included a tour of the Pennovation Center and attendance of a Introduction to Electrical Engineering class.

b. Nominations

Goal: Nominate Board members.

c. Speaker Series

Goal: Target 2-3 speakers to present to the Board following board meetings. Responsibilities: Identify and invite speakers. Speakers are generally Engineering faculty, or faculty doing work which may be of interest to the Board (previous speakers included an archeologist discussing use of technology in his work; and environmental scientist)

3. Engaging Students

a. Graduate BBQ

Goal: BBQ during the summer for graduate students. Responsibilities: Work with the Development Office to arrange the program. Attend the event and help (along with other volunteers) to sign-in and welcome guests. Note: Committee chair must be able to have 11-3 pm available on a weekday.

b. Mentoring/Externship

Goal: Mentoring and Externship programs for students Responsibilities: Work with Career Services to run the programs.

c. Patent Presentation (Next year: PE Presentation)

Goal: Hold a presentation of patent attorneys and related people to discuss the process of obtaining a patent. Responsibilities: Work with Career Services & Development office. Identify speakers. Some of the speakers can come from Penn's Center for Innovation.

d. Senior Design Competition

Goal: Provide judging for the senior design competition. Responsibilities: Review judging criteria; arrange scoring methods; facilitate the event; present/coordinate award distribution; Invited students from area high schools.

e. Student Engagement - AWE & SWE

Goal: Strengthen ties with the Advancing Women in Engineering program & SWE at Penn. Responsibilities: Connect with and work with the AWE staff person to develop joint programs with the board and AWE. Previous event included a "Tassel and Toast" event with graduating women and board members.

f. Student Engagement - ESAC

Goal: Strengthen ties in the undergraduate Engineering community.



Responsibilities: Reach out the ESAC to let them know the EAS board is around and willing to work with groups interested in developing joint programs. Present any interest to the board. Committee chair will be the primary contact for student groups interested in engaging with alumni.
