- Videos will include only the presenters and their demonstrations. Overhead text or graph slides will not be included on the video. Judges/Audience members will not be included in the video.
- There will be no live streaming of the event.
- Nondisclosure agreements/releases for Judges or Guests will not be required.
- There will be no restriction on the use of personal recording devices.
- There is a concern that it might turn off some groups from presenting.
- Tim: what raised this need? Walt: The reason is that a few years ago, there was an issue with a video that was published.
- Rosette: students may not have time to prepare for a provisional patent. Matt: This will be an unfortunately reality. Some students may not be interested in presenting.

- Rosette: Founder of StubHub gave a presentation where they had an idea and entered a competition, but chose not to enter the finals in order to not expose their idea to the public.
