President's Welcome and Remarks (F. Fresnel)

- Meeting called to order at 6:08pm after having to relocate due to a changed lock code on the normal meeting room door.
- Farnia met with Dean Glandt earlier today since he was not able to attend the Board meeting.
- The Volunteer Conference was held a few weeks ago:
 - Day-long session for the Presidents of the different alumni groups
 - Update was provided on how Penn did during the 2006-2013 campaign
 - \$4.3B raised in total
 - There were also non-financial goals which the alumni groups have a positive impact on:
 - Increased reunion attendance goal was 25% and 68% was achieved
 - Increased the number of active regional groups from 100 to 103
 - Increased alumni participation in recruiting activities by 87.9%
 - Penn has the second highest number of alumni on LinkedIn among the Ivy Schools
 - PACNet/QuakerNet will be going through an update
 - Increase in alumni speaking events was also seen
- Farnia suggested we should look at how to contribute to these non-financial targets as an organization
- Rosette and Career Services track our involvement in their activities and Engineering Alumni are much more involved than other schools

 - Penn had the second highest number of students in attendance (100+) behind Columbia

- This event has been going on for a number of years now and could be used as a good model for other groups to follow
- The BioEngineering event has been postponed to the Fall
 - The group thought they had more funding from ESAC then they ended up being offered
 - Room availability was also an issue
 - Now planning for an October event; room scheduling for the Fall opens up in the next week, so the group should begin looking into that now
 - Planning for roughly 50 students and 10 alumni
