## **Homecoming 2005**

Jason reminded the board of several SEAS sponsored events for Homecoming 2005 (Sat, Nov 5<sup>th</sup>) and passed around a volunteer sign-up sheet for the annual post-game reception at Levine Hall.

Maryann reported excellent on-line registration counts for all SEAS events, especially for the "Engineering of Movie Magic" event with Dr. Norm Badler. Other major events will include student demonstrations at the Weiss Tech House, viewings of the new ENIAC display, and the post-game reception.





### **Mentoring**

Nancy announced that a flow of new mentors and students continue to sign up and estimated that matches would occur by the end of the calendar year.

### **Contact with Student Groups**

Harris discussed the rekindling of the Board initiative that will focus on "building a bridge" between the Board and SEAS student groups. In January, new student group leaders will receive an introductory letter from the board. A meeting will be held between a board subcommittee and student leaders. The board would like to offer additional services to students and will use this meeting to seek input. Harris noted with regret that it has been a while since a SEAS student representative has attended a board meeting.

### **Yarnall Award**

Mickey announced that the nominating committee (Mickey, Michael O, Dick M., Craig S., Farnia Fresnal) had a "luxury of riches" from which to choose this year's honoree.

## **Website Update/Status**

Russ summarized recent changes to the board website and thanked Jackie for her assistance. He led the board through the current site and solicited suggestions which include the following:

- On front page, display the first sentence or two of the president's message while adding a "more" key.
- Update the events page, with an automatic "next event" field on the home page.
- Add more photos to the website, including pictures of the newer SEAS buildings
- Change the "alumni volunteer" heading to say "join the board"
- Add some flair to the mentoring home page (Harris)
- Walt noted that this board once discussed the possibility of a messageboard but security was an issue at the time. However, he added a safe alumni network online would be desirable

  Russ thanked Maryanne and Jackie for their support for improving the website.

# **Development Office Report**

George provided a comprehensive update of fund raising efforts to the board, while expressing optimism that 2005-2006 will be another 'great year'.





- George is working with a potential donor considering a \$2 million gift.
- The office is making good progress in securing estate gifts.
- Several receptions are being held this fall for Penn freshman, including ones in NY and San Francisco.
- On July 30<sup>th</sup>, 2006, the fee for sponsoring Junior Chairs and Endowed Scholarships will increase.
- Several gifts sponsoring Skirkanich Hall are expected

Walt said he would like to have a conference call in November to kick-off plans for the 2006 Senior Design Competition.
