Development Office Report (G. Hain)

The effort ended with \$10.8 million for the fiscal year (versus \$10 million goal). Average historically is \$13 to \$14 million per year. Recovery is happening – people are considering 5 year pledges, which is a step forward. The office is currently working on seven different possibilities for greater than \$1 million donations. George is hoping for a very good year coming up. There is \$35 million yet to raise over the next two years. George feels we are in good shape for this coming year to get the \$17.5 million, but the following year is more at risk.

George is asking for folks to help hit the \$1 million annual giving goal by moving up to the next gift club level. He also would like to know if the callers are asking you to move up to the next gift club.

Career Services Report (R. Pyne)
